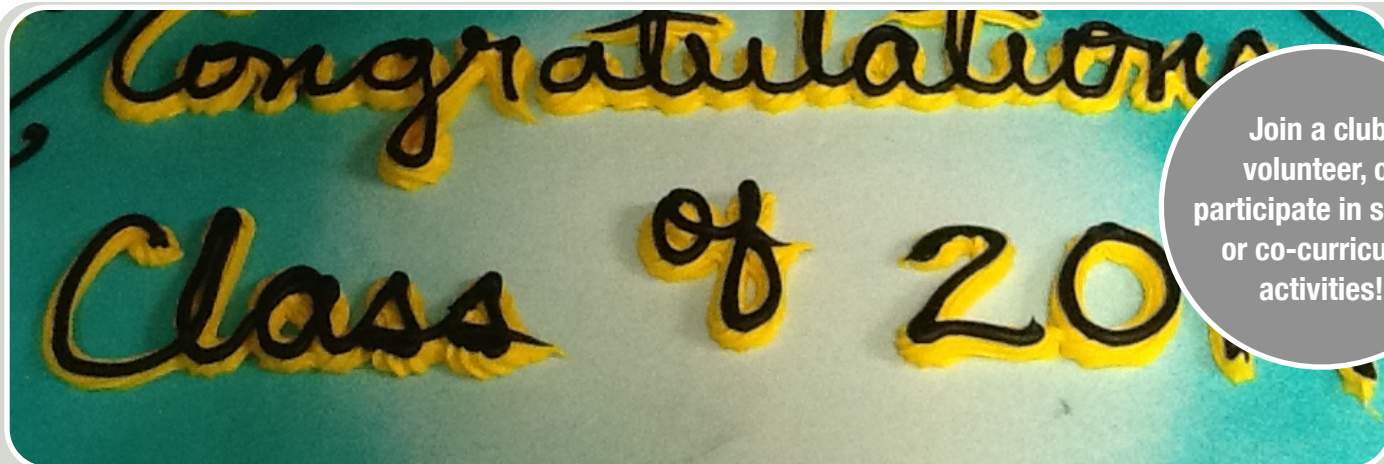

SOPHOMORE YEAR

- ✓ Continue to take & plan challenging high school courses!
- ✓ Continue to meet with your Career Specialist/Guidance Counselor!
- ✓ Investigate the kind of education/training different careers require!
- ✓ Take the PLAN test!
- ✓ Review the PLAN results with your Guidance Counselor & parents, begin to get tutoring in weak areas!
- ✓ Start collecting college/post-secondary information!
- ✓ Check out ACT's free college search @ <http://www.act.org/collegesearch/index.php#>
- ✓ Visit colleges and talk with college students!
- ✓ Be ready with a list of questions to ask on your campus visit <http://www.actstudent.org/college/visit.html>
- ✓ Use the "list of college characteristics" @ <http://www.actstudent.org/college/factors.html> to decide how to evaluate different colleges!
- ✓ Begin to compare the colleges/post-secondary schools in which you are interested!
- ✓ Continue/start saving for college!
- ✓ Consider your reasons for going to college/post-secondary school and how they relate to your career interests!
- ✓ Join/continue extracurricular activities!

JUNIOR YEAR

- ✓ Continue to take & plan challenging high school courses!
- ✓ Continue to meet with your Career Specialist/Guidance Counselor!
- ✓ Keep your grades up!
- ✓ Join an academic club!
- ✓ Take the PSAT test!
- ✓ Register for the ACT and the SAT and take a prep class to prepare!
- ✓ Sign up for the ASVAB to gauge career interests!
- ✓ Continue to visit colleges and talk with college students!
- ✓ Start or update an academic resume!
- ✓ Consider putting together a portfolio that highlights your special skills & talents!
- ✓ Investigate scholarship opportunities on the Guidance page of your school website!
- ✓ Check into applying to colleges/post-secondary schools online!
- ✓ Volunteer for activities & clubs related to career interests!
- ✓ Get a part-time job, apprenticeship, or job shadow in a profession that interests you!

SENIOR YEAR

- ✓ Continue to take & plan challenging high school courses!
- ✓ Keep your grades up; second semester grades can affect scholarship eligibility!
- ✓ Sign up for the SAT & ACT (if you didn't take them as a junior, or aren't satisfied with your score)!
- ✓ Visit with your Guidance Counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate and fully understand college/post-secondary admission requirements!
- ✓ Consider taking courses at a local university or community college (try an on-campus dual enrollment course)!
- ✓ Ask for personal references from teachers, school counselors, or employers early in the year or at least 2 weeks before application deadlines!
- ✓ Visit with admissions counselors who come to your high school!
- ✓ Attend a college/post-secondary school fair!
- ✓ Begin your college/post-secondary school essays!
- ✓ Apply for admission at the college/post-secondary school you've chosen!
- ✓ Avoid common college application mistakes, see a list @ <http://www.actstudent.org/college/mistakes.html>
- ✓ Find out if you qualify for scholarships at each college/post-secondary school to which you have applied!
- ✓ See your Guidance Counselor/Career Specialist for help finding financial aid/scholarships!
- ✓ Get help completing the FAFSA!
- ✓ Get transcripts sent after 1st semester to colleges/post-secondary schools; get your final transcripts sent in June!
- ✓ Visit colleges/post-secondary schools that have invited you to enroll!
- ✓ Decide which college/post-secondary school to attend & notify the school of your decision!
- ✓ Keep track of and observe deadlines for sending in all required paperwork, fees, and financial aid!
- ✓ Keep looking for scholarship opportunities!
- ✓ Watch the mail for your Student Aid Report (SAR) - it will arrive 4 weeks after the FAFSA is filed!
- ✓ Compare financial aid packages from different schools!
- ✓ Sign & send in a promissory note if you are borrowing money!
- ✓ Notify your college about any outside scholarships you received!

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

In order to be eligible for Bright Futures monies, you must earn a minimum of 100 volunteer hours during your High School career!

You can begin earning these hours during the summer before your 9th grade year!
