Course Syllabus

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Basic Theatre will provide students with a basic overview of theatre and what theatre has to offer.

Throughout the semester, students will be learning (amongst other things):

- Theatre vocabulary and stage terms
- Careers in the theatre as well as jobs inspired by the theatre.
- Theatre history
- Script reading and script writing
- Pantomime (time permitting)
- Performing short, memorized plays/skits
- Improvisation
- Theatre Etiquette
- Comparing stage plays to film adaptations of the plays and in some cases, television adaptations.
- And, of course, *performing*.

This class relies heavily on student participation. Participation is graded on the amount of volunteering, group involvement and the student's willingness to complete an activity which will directly impact their grade. There are several "activities" throughout the semester. *All* students will *perform in front of the class, in some form at least once a semester.*

COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS:

This year, in particular, there will be some flexibility in our weekly/daily assignments. Rest assured that you will be adhering to all standards mandated by the state but, in this trying time, we have to adjust, or as we say in the theatre, improvise!

COURSE GRADING AND POLICIES:

You will be quizzed weekly or bi-weekly on new vocabulary. theatre terms and on your "performances"

Please review the following information regarding grading.

Class grades will be based on the following:

40% Participation (Includes group, class and individual) 25% Daily work, Projects and Reports/Homework 15% Quizzes, Tests and Classroom Notebook 10% End of Curriculum Exam 10% Backstage Performance (daily points earned/deducted for classroom behavior and following classroom rules) _100%_

Late Work.

EX: A 100-point project

1 day late = -15 points (85)

2 days late = -10 additional points (75)

3 days late = -10 additional points (65)

5 days late = - 10 additional points (55)

No work accepted if more than 5 days late.

Assignments cannot be handed in more than 5 days late.

If the assignment is due before the end of a grading period or end of semester and it is late, it will not be accepted and a grade of "zero" will be recorded.

(Individuals are considered separately, if the work is group-oriented.)
