COURSE DESCRIPTION

The primary purpose of this course pertains to the study of American history from the Age of Exploration through the Reconstruction Period following the Civil War. You will be exposed to the historical, geographic, political, economic, and sociological events which influenced the development of the United States and the resulting impact on world history. This will allow you to clearly see the relationship between cause and effect in historical events while exploring the fundamental ideas and events that occurred in early United States history. As a result of this course, you will be able to explain the significance of relevant people, places, events, ideas, and documents, and recognize the connection between people and events within historical contexts. You will be able to understand and explain the opportunities, perspectives, and challenges associated with a diverse cultural population and diverse cultural experiences from Native Americans to African Americans.
