Major Concepts/Content:

The purpose of this course is to develop and strengthen reading skills using a balanced literacy approach. Students will be exposed to a variety of genres to achieve this goal including fictional, informational, multicultural, and technical texts. They will learn to read strategically through the use of before, during, and after reading techniques, and will also learn critical listening and effective speaking skills. By the end of their grade students will be expected to consistently and successfully read and comprehend texts with increased text complexity. Student will also be exposed to on level content as they gain mastery of strategies and skills needed to be successful middle/high school and beyond.
