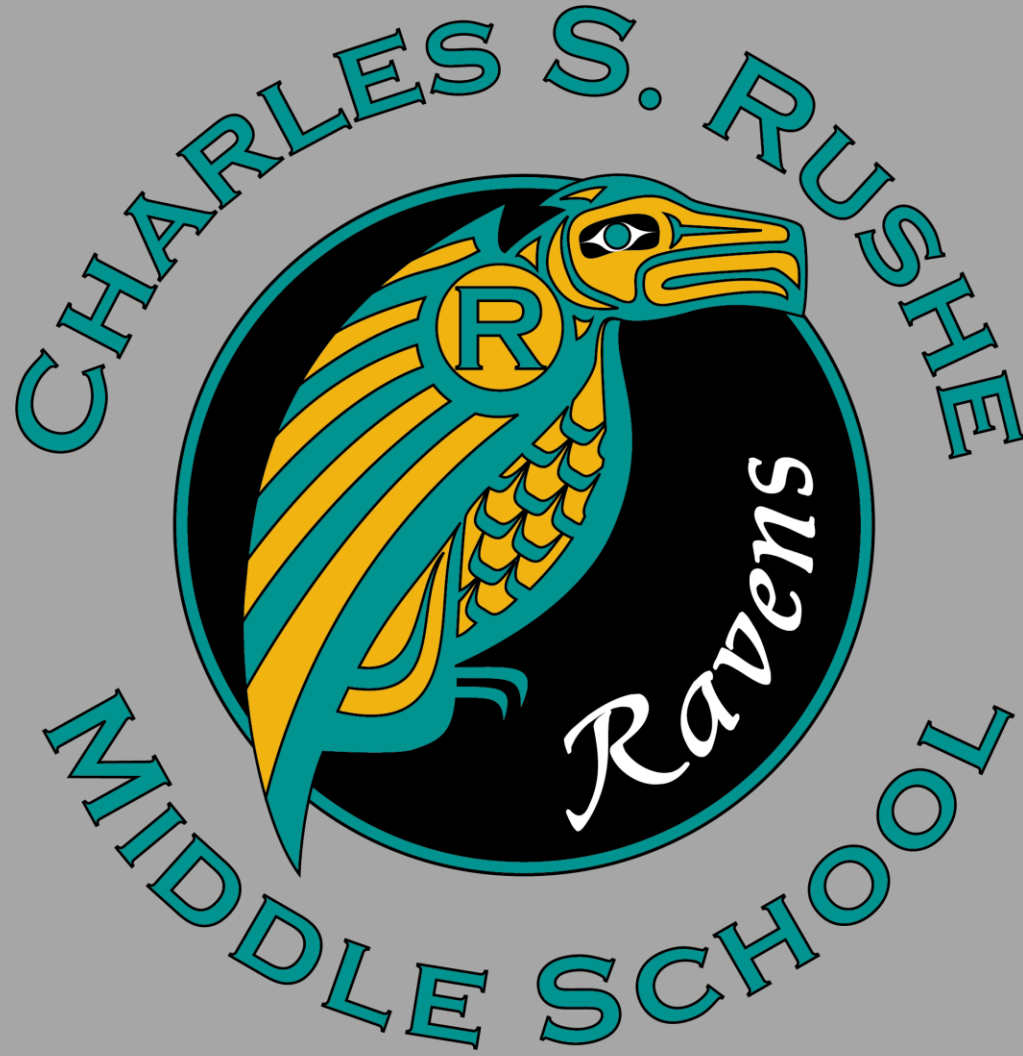

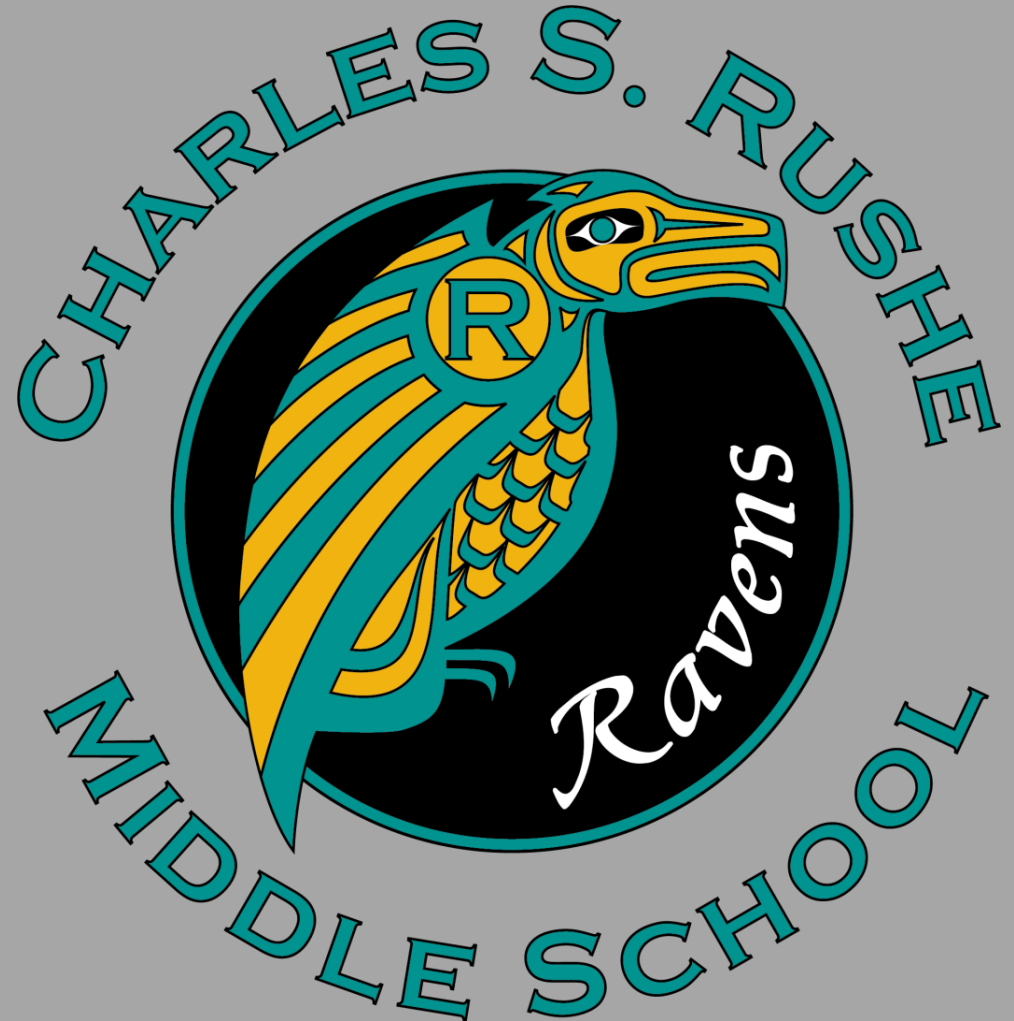
CSRMS SCHOOL MISSION *AND MOTTO*

BE AN INVOLVED PARENT: **SAC**

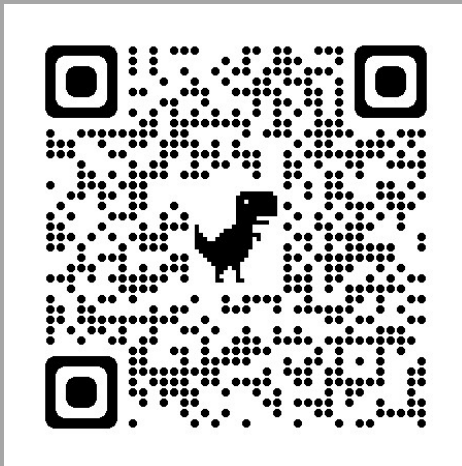
- Our SAC meets quarterly to review data, discuss issues, and learn about important topics related to our school.

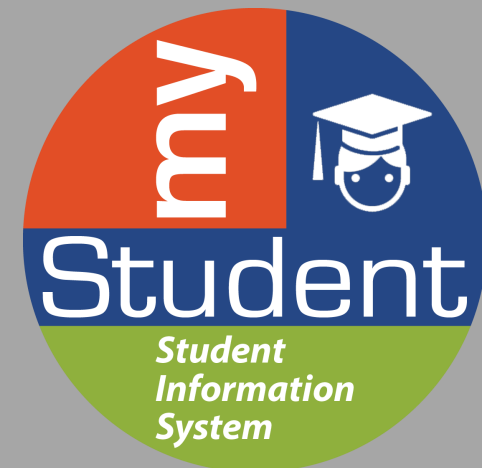
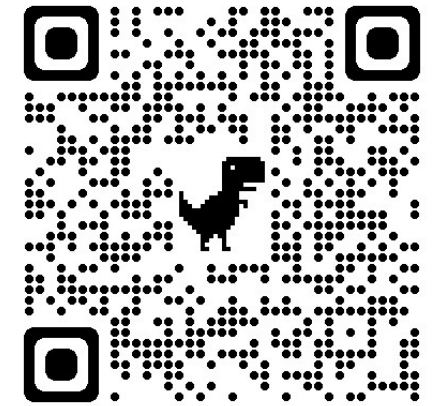

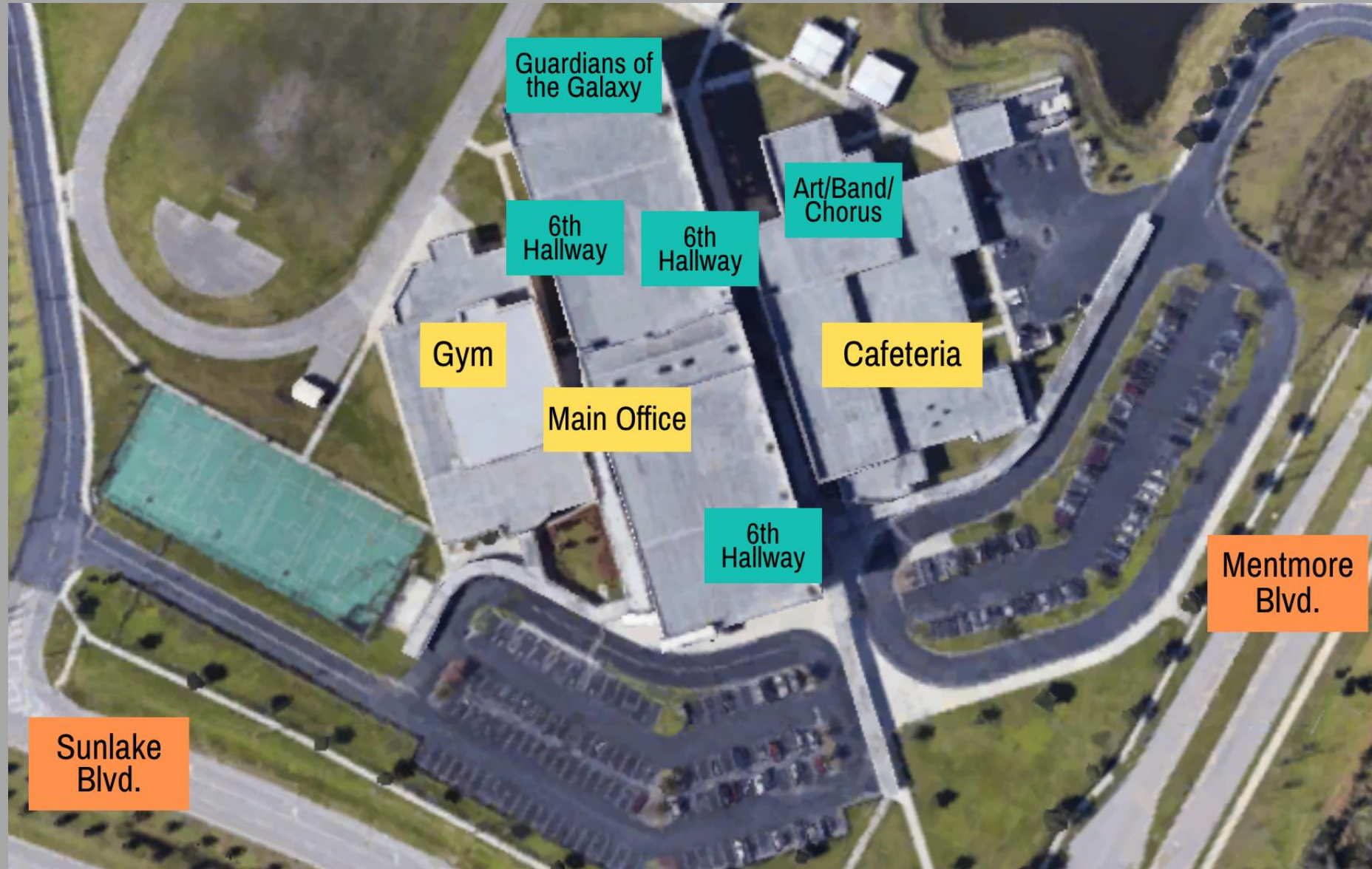


STUDENT SUPERVISION

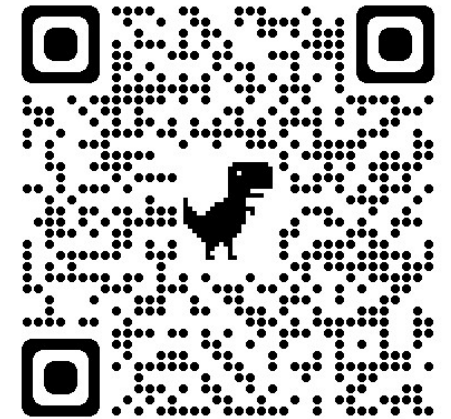

There are only 180 school days in an academic year...

If a student misses:

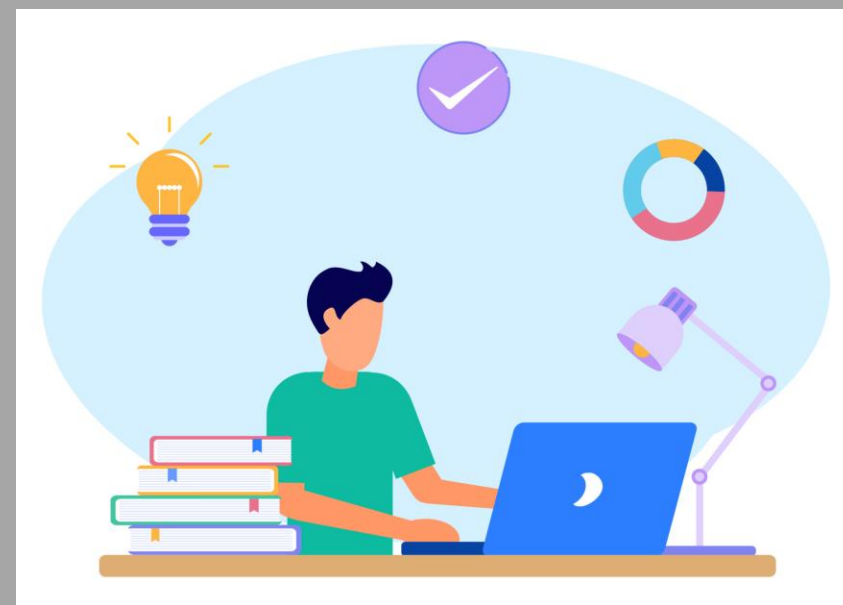
- 1 day of school = 270 minutes of instruction
- 3 days of school = 810 minutes of instruction
- 5 days of school = 1,350 minutes of instruction
- 10 days of school = 2,700 minutes of instruction
- 15 days of school = 4,050 minutes of instruction

MS Promotion Requirements

Students must take and pass the following to be promoted to high school:

- 3 years of Language Arts
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 3 years of Math
- 3 years of Science
- Career Component through Xello

****Students who fail any class must recover the course through Recovery or be retained in 8th grade.**

SCHEDULE CHANGES & POLICIES



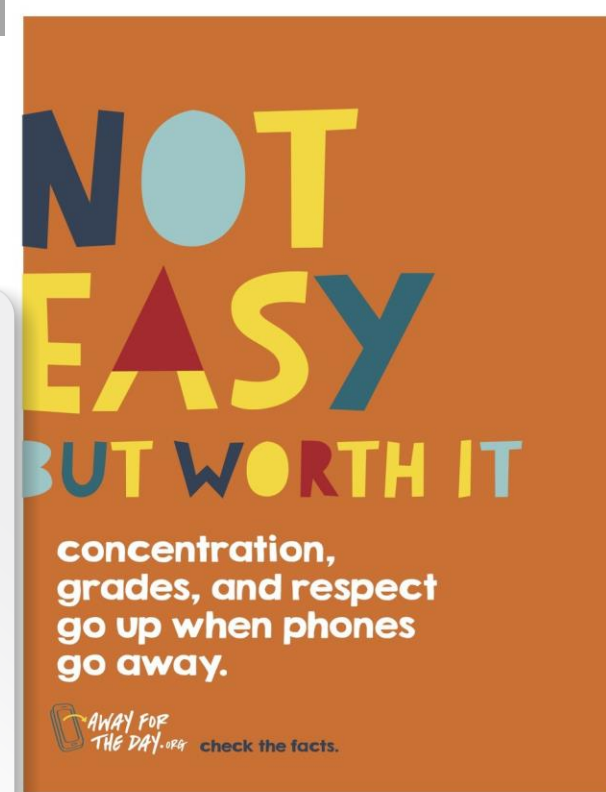
Schedule changes will only be made if:

- The student has already taken the course.
- A prerequisite is required for a course on your student's schedule.
- No schedule changes will be made if a student wants a different lunch or wants a class with a friend.



ELECTRONIC USE **POLICY**

Grades 6 through 8 – Students who bring WCDs to school must ensure that they remain on silent mode and completely out of view for the entire school day. Classroom teachers may also provide, and students may utilize, a cell phone storage area in their classroom.
